BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

Little biographical information on Thomas L. Rowlands is known. He was from the Madison, New York area. On November 6, 1862, at age 25, he enlisted in the 3rd New York Light Artillery as private in Battery H for a term of three years during the Civil War. His unit participated in operations in eastern North Carolina and around Petersburg and Richmond, Virginia. He was promoted to corporal on November 1, 1864, and to sergeant on January 1, 1865. Rowlands was mustered out of service on June 24, 1865 at Richmond, Virginia.

SCOPE AND CONTENT

This collection consists of a single letter written by Thomas L. Rowlands to his brother on January 6, 1864. At the time, Rowlands' artillery unit was stationed at Newport News, Virginia.

In the letter, Rowlands describes artillery training in preparation for the upcoming spring and summer campaign of 1864, the Russian fleet visiting Hampton Roads, the triple turreted USS *Roanoke*, and the USS *Minnesota*. He also mentions men reenlisting in his unit and writes sarcastically of men avoiding the draft back home. Rowlands also describes a minor engagement with Confederate forces, in which a "light monitor" and a "larger monitor" were sent to drive the rebels off.
