The Mariners' Museum and Park Selected For Fredericksburg Film Festival

NEWPORT NEWS, VA – The Mariners' Museum and Park has been selected for the first annual Fredericksburg Film Festival. The Museum's short film, *In the Name of the Oyster*, was submitted in the Documentary Short category. This honor is the first of its kind for The Mariners' and the film's director, Kyra Duffley.

"When our small, completely novice production team of two was started in 2021, we never could have imagined a possibility like this," said Kyra Duffley, Creative Director at The Mariners' Museum and Park. "I'm honored to share the story of mariners working in the world around us, reflected by these two 1908 paintings and then seen through the Mariners' mission of connecting people to the waters and one another."

In the Name of the Oyster was originally released as an installment of the Museum's popular Beyond the Frame series in October 2023. The film is based on paintings by Clifford Warren Ashley and features the female-owned Matheson Oyster Company and the all-female oyster team at the Chesapeake Bay Foundation. Uniting the paintings' subjects with real-world oyster harvesting and restoration practices, In the Name of the Oyster shines a light on environmental sustainability in a historic industry with considerable regional impact.

"My genuine hope when people see this film is that they will not only reflect on the actions they can take today to shape a better tomorrow—but also feel empowered to search deeper when looking at a work of art and use it as a catalyst to find and build connections with others," expressed Duffley.

The Fredericksburg Film Festival will be held May 2-5, 2024, with film screenings at locations throughout Downtown Fredericksburg. A virtual awards ceremony will be broadcast on Tuesday, May 7, 2024, on the Festival's <u>Instagram</u> and <u>Facebook</u> pages.
