The Mariners' Receives \$15,000 From Sentara Health to Support Lake Stewards

NEWPORT NEWS, Va— The Mariners' Museum and Park has received a \$15,000 grant from Sentara Health to support the Mariners' Lake® Stewards program during the 2024-25 school year. The award will fund student transportation, the purchase of supplies, teacher professional development, and staff time. This school year, 2,000 ninth-grade students will participate in Lake Stewards, an immersive program empowering students to become environmental stewards as they gain knowledge of Mariners' Lake and its ecosystem.

"What I love about the Lake Stewards program is that students are given the power to take action on climate-based solutions in their environment," said Senior Science Educator Shantelle Landry. "Many times, students might not feel as though they have much of a say or the ability to change things about their community. When we involve them, we show them that they are essential to their community and that they can have a positive impact on the health of their environment."

The Mariners' Lake Stewards program builds on the success of the Bay Watershed Education and Training (B-WET) curriculum, which has served over 4,000 students and nearly 70 teachers to date. Funding from Sentara equips The Mariners' Education Team to successfully grow and maintain the Lake Stewards program by expanding reach to Hampton City Schools and York County Public Schools and increasing the number of community partners served.

"It is always extremely rewarding to see students' faces light up when they are helping us plant grasses in an effort to improve the health of Mariners' Lake," Landry conveyed. "In the words of one of our participating students, 'I learned that my voice matters in the environment. I learned that I can help no matter how small my voice is. I learned that I can make a difference in the world."
